



Laguna Community Park

Conceived in concept by the CSD and the people in the Laguna area more than five years ago, today's dedication of Laguna Community Park's first phase marks the beginning of an exciting new recreational experience for the Elk Grove community. Installation of the 16-acre landscape and ball field portions of the park was completed in January. Improvements include two lighted softball fields, one lighted soccer field, one multi-use field, a tot lot, meandering walkways, lush landscaping, restrooms, a maintenance facility and the District's first dedicated off-leash dog park. Thanks to a \$51,000 grant from Home Field Advantage, the park includes scoreboards and bleachers.

Construction of the park's second phase improvements is anticipated to begin this Fall. The focal point of the park's remaining nine acres is construction of the Barbara Morse Wackford Community and Aquatic Complex. This new 43,000 square foot facility will feature an aquatics area housing a competition lap pool and bleacher seating, a recreation pool with water play features and water slides, multiple shade structures, locker room facilities, and two sand volleyball courts. The community center portion of the project will feature a large community meeting room, caterer's kitchen, regulation size gymnasium, teen center, outdoor patios, classrooms, restrooms, and reception areas. Second phase improvements are scheduled for completion by Spring of 2004.

Once fully completed, Laguna Community Park is expected to serve as a central gathering place for the community. Hours spent at the park will surely inspire laughter, play, and many fond memories for District residents in the years to come. These experiences all add to an enhanced sense of community. It is this spirit that the CSD Board of Directors and staff enthusiastically dedicate this park to the people of Elk Grove.
